

He made his concerto debut at the age of 13 with the La Sierra University Orchestra performing Beethoven's Piano Concerto No 3.

In March 2025 he performed Rachmaninov's Piano Concerto no 3 with the Royal Scottish National Orchestra in Edinburgh, Glasgow and Aberdeen.

Cellist **Alexandra Mackenzie** is internationally recognised as an outstanding performer and educator, has appeared at Carnegie Hall, Will Hall and Alice Tully. She has been a guest artist at Banff Centre for the Arts, and a Fellow at Tanglewood Other notable collaborations include extensive work with English Chamber Orchestra, Matthew Bourne's New Adventures company and playing on recordings for Quincy Jones and Michael Jackson. Alexandra teaches at the junior department of the Royal Academy of Music and was elected an ARAM in 2011.

Ingrid Sawers is a fine accompanist and chamber musician, performing widely throughout the UK, Europe, and Canada. She is equally at home performing vocal repertoire at the Oxford Lieder Festival or instrumental music at the World Saxophone Congress in Strasbourg. Work as a soloist ranges from Mozart's Ch'io mi scordi di te, with soprano Lorna Anderson, to Berio's Sequenza IV. She has toured widely with Classic FM presenter John Suchet in his talk "Beethoven -The Last Master".

The **Fibonacci Quartet** are one of Europe's leading young string quartets. Based in the UK and formed at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, the quartet hold residencies at the Escuela Superior de Musica Reina Sofia in Madrid with Günter Pichler and at the Dutch String Quartet Academy with Marc Danel, and frequently perform in association with ProQuartet in Paris.

Prolific competition winners, the Quartet have received numerous awards including both First Prize and the Audience Prize at the 13th 'Premio Paolo Borciani' International String Quartet Competition in 2024, First Prize in the Royal Overseas League Chamber Music Competition, During a busy 2024/25 season, they performed extensively throughout the UK and mainland Europe. The Fibonacci Quartet are generously supported by the Escuela Reina Sofía, the Hattori Foundation, Fondation Biermans-Lapôtre in Paris and Talent Unlimited.

The quartet are the current **YCAT** Hans Keller Artist, supported by the Cosman Keller Art & Music Trust.

The **Chloé Piano Trio** was formed in 2017 by talented emerging musicians at the Royal College of Music, London. They were previously winners of the Royal Philharmonic Society Henderson Chamber Music Prize 2021. They have performed across the UK and in France, Switzerland, Italy and the Netherlands; In March 2023 they performed in Wigmore Hall as finalists in the Parkhouse Award competition. They recently organised the first edition of the 'Chloé Festival', a three day event in Greenwich, centred around women composers & artists. They performed for HRH King Charles during his President Visit at the Royal College of Music in March 2020.

The **Tim Kliphuis Trio** combines jaw-dropping virtuosity and mesmerizing improvisations with a repertoire sourced from classical, gypsy jazz and North-European folk music.

Award-winning violinist Tim Kliphuis (Netherlands) and Scotsmen Nigel Clark (guitar) and Roy Percy (double bass) celebrate their 18th year of touring together.

The Trio's new, 11-movement suite 'Pictures at an Exhibition' takes Mussorgsky's 150-year-old masterpiece and brings it into our own age. New pieces, written by Tim himself, bring into focus some truly great works by Van Gogh, Hokusai, Klimt and Georgia O'Keeffe. After the break, contemporary re-interpretations of Vivaldi and Bach's from their SONY Classical releases 'Reflecting the Seasons' and 'Brandenburg', and some movements from 'The Five Elements' which look at our future on this planet. www.timkliphuis.com

The Kosonen Ranieri Duo was formed in 2021, by pianist Mianoora Kosonen and violist Arianna Ranieri, upon their graduation from their Masters courses from the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. They are passionate about bringing a wider variety to the existing viola and piano performance repertoire. Highlights have included performing for The Princess Royal in 2022 and at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe plus concert tours together as a part of the Women In Chamber Music ensemble of which they are co-founders.

Arianna Ranieri is an Italian American freelance violist and music instructor. She received her Bachelor of Music Performance from Northern Kentucky University and in 2021 her Master of Music degree from the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in 2021.

Mianoora Kosonen is a Finnish pianist, accompanist and piano instructor. She studied at Helsinki Conservatory, they moved to Scotland and graduated from the Master of Arts program at the RCS in 2021. Mianoora is an arranger and composer, and her composition work is currently supported by the Finnish (Kansan Sivistysrahasto) foundation for her upcoming work for solo piano, which is themed around the nature of Finland and Scotland.

Mark O'Keeffe has held the post of principal trumpet with the BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra since December 1996. He plays chamber music with Scottish based Red Note Ensemble and also London Sinfonietta, and has



been guest Principal Trumpet with the World Orchestra for Peace, London Symphony Orchestra, London Philharmonic Orchestra and many more.

Classical guitarist Sasha Savaloni is the winner of two of the most prestigious guitar competitions in Europe; the

Sevilla International Guitar Competition (2018) and the New Elizabethan Award (2022). As a soloist he has given concerts across Europe and throughout the UK, performing recitals in venues such as the Wigmore Hall, Kings Place (London), Usher Hall (Edinburgh) and The Shoe Factory (Nicosia), as well as taking part in music festivals in London, Orkney, Paris and Seville.
